

Stories from the Heart

An Incredible Journey

Vicki experienced a heart attack at work on August 4, 2023, and was immediately transferred to Bon Secours Memorial Regional Medical Center (MRMC). The diagnosis was three blockages in her heart, which required coronary artery bypass surgery. Following surgery, Vicki was in the MRMC Cardiovascular Intensive Care Unit. This Intensive Care Unit (ICU) is a



Universal Bed Unit which allows the patient to remain in his or her room until discharge. One advantage of this care model is a patient experiencing a life-threatening complication after heart surgery can immediately upgrade to ICU level care. In Vicki's case, this innovative care model helped save her life. "The care I received in the unit was remarkable. Every nurse and doctor was compassionate and attentive, especially with my family who were worried." After her bypass surgery, Vicki experienced symptoms that were concerning, and it was quickly determined her decline was due to a Heparin-induced thrombocytopenia (HIT), a rare and potentially devastating reaction to the presence of heparin in her system. Heparin is an anticoagulant used during bypass surgery. Unfortunately, Vicki suffered a more catastrophic form of this rare allergic reaction, whereby blood clots formed in her heart arteries as well as her newly constructed bypasses. This led her heart to fail and a rapid decompensation where Vicki became extremely sick. Fortunately, she promptly transitioned back to ICU level care. Vicki required immediate intervention in the Cath Lab, which confirmed the reaction had caused an occlusion in her new bypasses. While in the Cath Lab, her heart stopped, and Vicki suffered a brief cardiac arrest. Vicki was stabilized and transferred to St. Mary's Hospital for a possible long term heart pump and close management by the Bon Secours Advanced Heart Failure Team. She was in the hospital for a total of 33 days and made a

remarkable recovery. Vicki frequently mentions her incredible support system, which includes her husband, children, friends, and church. "I have the complete package, and it has made all the difference in my recovery." Vicki has made tremendous strides and is currently wearing a cardiac LifeVest, which is a wearable defibrillator for patients at risk of sudden cardiac event. She will begin cardiac therapy soon and looks forward to a stronger and healthier heart!

Her passion for nursing and caring for patients at the bedside motivated her to return to school and become a Critical Care Nurse. "I love



my job and the opportunity to care for critically ill patients. I work in the new CVICU and the teamwork in this unit is phenomenal. When Vicki's health rapidly declined, we did not have to move her to receive a higher level of care. The team was there and could immediately identify that there was a problem and respond to her needs. This saved time and her life.

Bon Secours Richmond is among four Bon Secours Mercy Health markets offering cardiovascular clinical trial enrollment options to our patients. As of October 2023, we have 40 trials open across the system. By conducting clinical trials, we uniquely offer opportunities to our community-based patients. Our patients get access to tomorrow's medicine today, which has traditionally only been available in large academic settings. We have participated in research that has changed the indications for heart failure treatment, advanced arrhythmia care, introduced alternatives to open heart surgery with minimally invasive valve replacement, and helped bring new pharmaceuticals to market with superior efficacy and lower side effects for the treatment of high cholesterol. You're Making a Difference by Giving from the Heart

For patients at the Bon Secours Advanced Heart Failure Center at St. Mary's Hospital, their care is even better now that they have the tools to check their weight and blood pressure thanks to the Bon Secours Richmond Health Care Foundation. Sheree Lee, a patient at the Advanced Heart Failure



Center, uses the scale and blood pressure cuff to weigh herself and take her blood pressure daily. Staff showed Sheree how to use the donor-funded devices. Changes in Sheree's numbers could mean a critical medication update is needed. With these simple tools, Sheree is empowered to monitor her health, and to recognize and report concerns before more serious problems develop. Sheree is grateful to the donors who make these devices available to patients struggling with advanced heart failure. "Since I started coming to the Center and recording my weight and blood pressure, my health has improved a lot!"

Sheree also credits her improving health to the Advanced Heart Failure Center doctors who she says take time to ask about her condition and listen to her answers. "I just thank everybody for everything they've done — the nurses, the doctors and especially for the scale and the blood pressure cuff," Sheree says. "I am blessed." We at the Advanced Heart Failure Center are so thankful for the support from the Bon Secours Richmond Health Care Foundation. With their generous gifts, we can offer blood pressure cuffs and scales to any of our patients who are unable to afford them. This allows us to ensure all patients have the tools they need



for monitoring and early detection of heart failure problems.
