## More than 60 years ago,

three Catholic sisters from the Congregation of Bon Secours arrived in Richmond with the mission of establishing a hospital. For five years, they labored over every detail — formulating plans, raising money, supervising construction, purchasing equipment, hiring staff, while continuing to nurse the sick and dying in their homes. When St. Mary's Hospital opened its doors in the early days of 1966, the community learned the true meaning of the French words bon secours: good help. St. Mary's was Richmond's first Catholic hospital, its first hospital run by women, and its first racially integrated hospital.

#### 2013


Emergency Department expands, creating a redesigned entrance with separate adult and pediatric emergency departments

A new Critical Care Tower is an essential part of this vision, designed to address the evolving needs of our patients. The planned \$370 million expansion of the existing hospital will include construction of an














eight-story structure, renovations of existing facilities, and other improvements.
